Clock Time and God's Time

The New Year draws our attention to the passage of time much in the same way as birthdays and anniversaries. The regularity of these observances is closely linked to natural cycles of the sun and the seasons. But something still feels arbitrary about celebrating the passage of another 365 days, such that I have friends whose birthday greetings often consist of "Congratulations on surviving another trip around the sun!"

The Bible uses two words for time: *chronos* (clock time) and *kairos* (the first syllable rhymes with pie), which means "the right time," a critical moment. Theologian Robert Capon describes it as "high time" or "due season," as in "it's high time we get this show on the road!" *Chronos* is measurable, and marches ever onward, even while we sleep. *Kairos* is qualitative, focused not on quantity or duration, but on meaning, value and importance.

Anyone with a wristwatch, wall clock, smartphone or sundial can keep track of *chronos*, but *kairos* can be more difficult to discern. This may be one reason New Year's resolutions so often fail to produce meaningful, lasting change. The calendar cannot tell us when it's time to start a good new habit or try to break an old bad one. The clock cannot tell us when we're sufficiently dissatisfied with the present, with a clear vision of a better future and practical first steps in a new direction, sufficient to overcome our natural resistance to change, plus costs or pain associated with a particular change.

However, the turning of a New Year can draw our attention to dissatisfaction with what is and dreams for what could be. The downtime of the holidays can provide space to brainstorm practical steps in the right direction and muster the motivation to overcome both inertia and internal resistance to change.

About a year ago Sister Jennie and I decided to join the local YMCA – which for various reasons didn't happen until February – and I launched myself into gym machine strength training. Right away I wondered why I had let six and a half years of clock time pass without it in my life. There's no shortage of good reasons, of course. But since then I've slowly added walking, then swimming, and most recently, indoor cardio that I don't totally hate. Combined with dietary changes forced by a health crisis this past June, everyone can see the difference.

What's true about change in our personal life is true of change in the church. We must be sufficiently dissatisfied with what is, have a clear vision steeped in prayer and meditation for where God is leading us next, and build a list of concrete next steps. It's still a little early in my time with you to start talking about any real changes – any real change is genuinely scary, and my family's presence among you is a big change all on its own – but it's never too early to start praying for God's vision for where we're supposed to be headed when the time is right!





LOOKING FOR A LOW-IMPACT WAY TO IMPROVE YOUR HEALTH AND FLEXIBILITY IN 2025?






Free Adjustable Beds!!
